### COSTS DECLINING

#### New low-cost section of Moby lot:

**\$400** faculty, staff and off-campus student permit

(reduced from \$582 or \$536)

\* Discounts and subsidies do not apply

#### New low-cost Ingersoll lot:

**\$400** residence hall students

(reduced from \$628)

**\$8** daily permits in Moby lot

**\$6** daily permits in Research lot

**\$1.25** short-term Moby lot

### COSTS INCREASING

Faculty and staff annual permits

Students who commute

Reserved parking

Includes current A section at Moby

Residence Hall permits

(did not increase to proposed rate in 2016)

New government vehicle permits

### COSTS UNCHANGED

**\$250** Research Blvd lot permit

**\$12** daily permits

**\$1.75** per hour at short-term pay stations

**50% subsidy** for employees earning less than \$35,000

### Expanded Reserved Parking Spaces



Located primarily in core of campus

For faculty and staff

Initially up to 5 percent of parking spaces (49 new reserved spaces):

- > Engineering (13)
- > Library (12)
- > Animal Sciences (5)
- > Lake Street Garage (10)
- > Administration (+2)
- > VTH West (7)

### New Special Permit Option

#### DAYS-OF-THE-WEEK PERMITS

Limited to specific days of the week

- > Monday, Wednesday, Friday permits
- > Tuesday, Thursday permits

Requests for permits that flex to the schedules of commuter student, faculty and staff, and those who use alternative transportation

### New: Permits Required for All Government Vehicles

Beginning July 1, all government (federal, state, county, city, CSU) vehicles must have permit or pay for time at a pay station

Vehicles used less than once a week may only be parked at the Research Blvd lot or on Foothills campus

Visitors to campus driving government vehicles must pay for parking (purchase a daily or annual permit or pay at a pay station)

State and services spaces will become spaces for service vehicles only. Service vehicles include CSU and private vehicles for plumbers, electricians, HVAC, technical support, etc., who service CSU buildings and equipment

Service vehicles must have a J permit (issued to service vehicles only) to park on campus, or pay at a pay station.

Emergency vehicles always exempted only when responding to an emergency. When on campus for other purposes, a permit or payment at a pay station is required.

### 30-Year Employee Permit Program

200 free permits (or reduced for those who qualify for reserved parking) last year

AVERAGE SALARY OF PLAN PARTICIPANT IS \$104K+

ANNUAL COST OF THIS PLAN IS \$100K

#### CREATE A SCALED PLAN:

- > 30+ years of service and earn <\$50K free A permit
- > 30+ years of service and earn >\$50K but <\$75K receive 50 percent discount on A permit
- > Earn \$75K or more pay full price
- > Discount above can be used to reduce other higher-cost permit price options
